

**SPRING 2015**

Districts/schools should schedule accordingly with no breaks (one-week spring break is allowed) or professional days scheduled within the 20-day or 10-day test window. For example, a district/school may schedule 3 five-day weeks, skip a week for spring break and schedule the last five-day week of the window for a total of 20 days.

April 13 – May 1	End-of-Course tests	<b>English Language Arts and Mathematics</b> Grades 3-8 and High School <i>Paper/pencil</i>  <i>The grade 3 ELA will not be administered in spring 2015</i>
May 4 – 15	End-of-Course tests	<b>Science</b> – Grades 5 and 8 and High School <b>Social Studies</b> – Grades 4 and 6 and High School <i>Computer or paper/pencil (district choice)</i>
